View From The Edge Of The Crowd by Lee Schell

Something happened, last month, that solidified my distrust of the medical care we receive in this country. Prior to the tragic incident about which I am about to tell you, we endured over two-and-a-half years of the Covid pandemic. During that terrible time we were forced to stay in our homes. When we did venture out we had to wear masks and many of us were forced to get an unproven vaccine just to keep our jobs so we could support our families. Many of our military were kicked out of their profession because they balked at getting jabbed with a substance that had never been properly tested and was totally misrepresented. Those of us who for which the vaccine injections were not mandated, were coerced into getting them. We were told we owed it to our family

Now you know why I, and many others like me, will never again trust our medical system.
