# PAUL R. GREGORY Hoover Institution

A research fellow at the Hoover Institution, Mr. Gregory is also Cullen Professor Emeritus in the Department of Economics at the University of Houston, a research fellow at the German Institute for Economic Research in Berlin, and emeritus chair of the International Advisory Board of the Kiev School of Economics. Gregory has held visiting teaching appointments at Moscow State University and the Free University of Berlin.

Gregory was the director of the Russian Petroleum Legislation Project of the University of Houston Law Center from 1992 to 1997 and has written broadly on Russian energy. The holder of a PhD in economics from Harvard University, he is the author or coauthor of twelve books and more than one hundred articles on economic history, the Soviet economy, transition economies, comparative economics, and economic demography.

As a producer, Paul Gregory worked with director Marianna Yarovskaya on the documentary film, *Women of the Gulag*, which was short-listed for the 2019 Academy Awards. The film was based on his most recent book, *Women of the Gulag: Portraits of Five Remarkable Lives* (Hoover Institution Press, 2013).
