DISCERNMENT

I remember a time when I was young, and I saw a commercial on TV for some product. I thought it was a good product because of the claims made in the commercial. Somehow the discussion came up at the dinner table one night and I recall saying "it must be true, or they would not be allowed to say it". Of course, my parents thought my statement was hilarious. That was the beginning of my discernment lesson.

Over the years I've been able to exercise my discernment muscle especially when it came to advertising and marketing. I've studied how easy it is to become a victim of marketing propaganda. It's easy to trick the mind into thinking something is good, just by the way it is presented, only to discover it's not good at all. I enjoyed studying this topic in college and found it fascinating.

As a proud American, I believed the media would not lead me astray. I read articles from journalists like Carl Bernstein, who broke the Watergate scandal along with *Bob Woodward (oh how far he has strayed from truth now)*. Ed Bradley was on the nightly news covering the Vietnam War. Tom Brokaw anchored NBC's *Nightly News* and became a familiar face in the elections from 1982 all the way to 2004. The 1980s was also a time for women in journalism to emerge with icons such as Barbara Walters, Connie Chung, and even Oprah Winfrey. Yes, there was a time I enjoyed listening to the wisdom of Oprah Winfrey. What was I thinking? I wasn't. Discernment muscle, where are you?

Like many others, I began to wake up on September 11, 2001. The stories the media was telling me were no longer matching the reality of what I was seeing. The propaganda, defined as "information, especially of a biased or misleading nature, used to promote or publicize a particular political cause or point of view" started to rear its ugly head. Let us be a light on the path for those that follow, and help our young people learn to exercise their discernment muscle.

This is our country. Let's not let it fail.

We are [just] days away from Election Day, and I am cautiously hopeful about my own reelection and the passage of Prop. 36. But our opponents are still throwing everything they can at us. Thank you to all for your support in both races.

Today, a new PPIC study <u>confirmed</u> that Prop. 47 significantly increased property crime in California. Of course, a study isn't really necessary – stores aren't keeping shampoo and conditioner under lock and key for fun. Prop. 36 will reverse this trend by making crime illegal again.

This election comes as the long-time trend of Democrats gaining on Republicans in California has been reversed for four straight voter registration cycles. Whichever party you typically support, more balance is good news for our state; the coalition for common sense is ascendant.

Another sign we could be turning a corner is the local DA races. LA District Attorney George Gascón is about to lose his reelection in an absolute landslide. The DA for Oakland is also facing a recall amidst out-of-control crime.

In other news, this past Sunday science fiction became reality. SpaceX launched its Starship rocket, the most powerful ever built – and then minutes later, the rocket returned to the same tower from which it was launched, caught using giant "chopsticks."

What is just as stunning as the feat itself is the fact that the bureaucracy wanted to stop it. After the FAA invented absurd bureaucratic reasons to delay the launch by two months, I confronted FAA head Michael Whitaker about it at a hearing.

You can watch my questioning here, during which Whitaker made numerous statements that were proven false. The next day, I gave a speech on the House Floor questioning his fitness to lead the FAA. Thankfully, a few days ago the FAA relented and cleared Sunday's historic launch.

Yet amidst the positives, there is some bad news: Newsom's CARB board is planning to <u>raise gas prices</u> by 65 cents per gallon. Conveniently, they're doing it 3 days *after* the election. We are restoring sanity in California, but plenty of insanity remains.

November 5, 2024, Statewide Ballot Measures CFRW EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDED POSITIONS

PROPOSITION 2 - OPPOSE

Authorizes Bonds for Public School and Community College Facilities.

PROPOSITION 3 - OPPOSE

Constitutional Right to Marriage.

PROPOSITION 4 - OPPOSE

Authorizes Bonds for Safe Drinking Water, Wildfire Prevention, and Protecting Communities and Natural Lands from Climate Risks.

PROPOSITION 5 - OPPOSE

Allows Local Bonds for Affordable Housing and Public Infrastructure with 55% Voter Approval.

PROPOSITION 6 - OPPOSE

Eliminates Constitutional Provision Allowing Involuntary Servitude for Incarcerated Persons.

The Power of One Vote, YOUR Vote. Use It!

In 1800 – Thomas Jefferson was elected President by one vote in the House of Representatives after a tie in the Electoral College.

In 1824 – Andrew Jackson won the presidential popular vote but lost by one vote in the House of Representatives to John Quincy Adams after an Electoral College dead-lock.

In 1845 – The U.S. Senate passed the convention annexing Texas by two votes (27/25).

In 1846 – President Polk's request for a Declaration of War against Mexico passed by one vote.

In 1867 – The Alaska purchase was ratified in the Senate by two votes: 37-2, paving the way for future statehood.

In 1868 – President Andrew Johnson was Impeached but not convicted because the Senate was one vote shy of the necessary two thirds required.

In 1876 – Samuel Tilden won the presidential popular vote but came up one electoral vote shy and lost to Rutherford B. Hayes.

In 1941 – Congress amended the active-service component of the Selective Service Act from one year to two-and-a-half years by one vote, 203 to 202.

In 1948 – A Texas Convention voted for Lyndon B. Johnson over ex-Governor Coke Steven in a contested Senatorial election.

In 1962 – Governors of Maine, Rhode Island and North Dakota were elected by an average of one vote per precinct.

In 1977 – Vermont State representative Sydney Nixon was seated as an apparent one vote winner, 570 to 569. Mr. Nixon resigned when the State House determined, after a recount, that he had actually lost to his opponent Robert Emond 572 to 571.

In 1989 – A Lansing, Michigan School District millage proposition failed when the final recount produced a tie vote 5,147 for, and 5,147 against. On the original vote count, votes against the proposition were ten more than those in favor. The result meant that the school district had to reduce its budget by \$2.5 million.

In 1994 – 1.1 votes per precinct in Alaska elected Tony Knowles as Governor and Fran Ulmer as Lieutenant Governor out of 216,668 votes cast in the General Election.

In 1994 – Republican Randall Luthi and Independent Larry Call tied for a seat in the Wyoming House of Representatives from the Jackson Hole area with 1,941 votes each. A recount produced the same result. Mr. Luthi was finally declared the winner when, in a drawing before the State Canvassing Board, a ping pong ball bearing his name was pulled from the cowboy hat of Democratic Governor Mike Sullivan.

In 1997 – Dakota Democrat John McIntyre led Republican Hal Wick 4,195 to 4,191 for the second seat in Legislative District 12 on election night. A subsequent recount showed Wick the winner at 4,192 to 4,191. The State Supreme Court however, ruled that one ballot counted for Wick was invalid due to an over-vote. This left the race a tie. After hearing arguments from both sides, the State Legislature voted to seat Wick 46 to 20.

In 2000 – The Presidential election was decided by an extremely narrow margin. George W. Bush won the state of Florida by just 537 votes, making him the next President of the United States. Close to 6 million voters went to the polls in Florida. It might not have been by one vote, but certainly every vote counted.

In 2006 – Connecticut's 2nd U.S. Congressional seat was won by Joe Courtney with 121,252 votes to Rob Simmons' 121,158; a difference of only 94 votes.

In 2008 – Stockton, California: The Stockton Unified School Trustee Area No. 3 seat was won by one vote. Jose Morales received 2,302 votes while Anthony Silva received 2,301.

In 2008 – Minnesota voters cast 2.9 million votes in their US Senate race that may be decided by as few as 200 votes (1/1000th of one %).

In 2010 – In Nevada, the Nye County Primary contest for County Commissioner District IV was a dead heat with both Butch Borasky and Carl Moore receiving 381 votes. In the Lincoln County Primary, the District Attorney race was decided by only 3 votes.

- Democrats regret their coup: With election polls showing a toss-up victory for Kamala Harris at best or a landslide win for Donald Trump at worst, panicking Democrats have begun to question whether the ouster of Joe Biden was the wrong move. The Leftmedia fanfare and "good vibes" when Harris first took over are gone, as she has failed to deliver despite a mountain of positive press singing her praises while simultaneously vilifying Trump as a "threat to democracy." Hence, there seems to be growing remorse and a belief that Biden, despite his clearly diminished state, is the better politician with broader support. Indeed, Bob Woodward delves into Biden's record as president in his new book, War, wherein he argues that Joe's diminishment was physical and not mental. Meanwhile, despite no concerns regarding her age or physical ability, Harris clearly lacks the political dexterity to get her message across in an easily understandable and winsome manner. The more Americans have gotten to know her, the more she has turned them off.
- James Carville calls for insurrection: You can feel the panic among leftists as they feel a presidential election slipping away. And desperate times call for desperate and unhinged rhetoric including talk of insurrection. Take former Clinton strategist James Carville, for example. In a recent chat with MSNBC's Ari Melber, Corporal Cueball reflected on the political environment just prior to the two bloodiest conflicts in the history of the Republic: the Civil War and World War II. "When the Republic was threatened," said Carville, "people picked up arms and answered the call. Or, you know, in 1965, in the middle of the Civil Rights movement, I think people decided they were gonna take matters into their own hands and create a better country, and that's what I hope we do here in the next few weeks." So, where's the outrage? Where are the denunciations from Carville's fellow Democrats about this dangerous rhetoric, this call to arms, this naked threat to "the peaceful transfer of power" that they're constantly chirping about?
- Obama mystified by division: "I don't understand how we got so toxic and just so divided and so bitter," Barack Obama marveled at a campaign rally for Kamala Harris in Wisconsin on Tuesday. Well, Obama might find the answer to that question by taking a hard look in the mirror. After all, there's a reason why he was dubbed the "divider-in-chief." To borrow a phrase from his pastor, Jeremiah Wright, Barack's "chickens are coming home to roost." In 2008, Obama smeared Republican voters as "bitter" for how they "cling to guns or religion." In 2014, he called racism "something that's deeply rooted in our society, deeply rooted in our history." He infamously and repeatedly lectured and scolded Americans who didn't share his political views as "backward" and "on the wrong side of history." And he now bullies black men into voting for Harris. While Obama claimed to want to unite America, his clear expectation was for everyone to get in line with his political vision. No wonder we're more divided than before he came onto the scene.
- Joe Rogan will soon experience Donald Trump: The political media winds are shifting away from the Big Three networks and toward other media outlets, and Donald Trump gets it. Much like Ronald Reagan talked over the top of the networks and directly to the American people, Trump is taking his message to audiences that might not otherwise hear it. On Friday, for example, Trump will head to Austin, Texas, to do an interview with Joe Rogan, whose podcast boasts 14 million followers on Spotify. Rogan has been critical of Trump in the past, even blurting out the leftist idiocy that he is "an existential threat to democracy." But, as Politico notes, "Rogan has more recently been complimentary of Trump, saying last month that the economy under Trump 'did really well and he really did try to cut some of the [crap] down that's going on in this country.""
- Trump now leads Harris by 11 points among Hispanics: A recent <u>USA Today/Suffolk poll</u> showed a tight race between Kamala Harris and Donald Trump, but it's hard to see how they have it so tight, given Harris's continued hemorrhage of core Democrat constituencies. For example, buried beneath the top-line news from that poll is a stunning stat about the voting preference of the nation's largest minority: "The new poll showed Latino voters backing Trump with 49% to Harris' 38%." What this shows is that Trump continues to expand the Republican tent. As Fox News <u>reports</u>, he continued to make his case to Hispanics during a roundtable with Latino leaders in Miami yesterday. So much for the Democrats' cynical belief that a browner America is a more "Democratic" America.
