
## NOMINATING COMMITTEE FOR 2024-2025 OFFICERS





## The GOP Can't Survive the Only-Trumpers

Too bad Donald Trump won't attend the second Republican presidential primary debate next week at the Ronald Reagan Library.

How will he do today? We should be able to watch the 2023 Model Trump in action, but we won't because he's playing safe and selfish.

To me, what's even more sad — and worrisome for the GOP's chances in 2024 — is hearing Trump say he won't promise to support whoever the party's nominee is if it isn't him.

There are some conservative pundits in the media-sphere who agree with Trump.

They're telling the MAGA Republicans listening to their shows that there's no one but Trump to vote for and everyone else is a RINO.

They're saying they won't vote for anyone but Trump, which is dumb. And then, when the Republicans get crushed in 2024 because people don't show up at the polls, the same pundits will cry that we were cheated.

My father would be appalled at these suicidal Trump-only Republicans. He always supported the nominee of the Republican Party and set the bar when it comes to party solidarity.

Republicans are in serious trouble. We haven't won a plurality of the presidential popular vote since George H.W. Bush did it in 1988.


We need to win back the majority of voters if we ever hope to regain the White House. And if Republicans can't do that after the harm Democrats have done to the country for the last three years, when will they ever?

# TAKE-AWAYS FROM DR. GLORIA HOM'S PRESENTATION ON SEPTEMBER 21, 2023

California Primary and General Election Important Dates:

February 5, 2024 – Last day to register to vote in the Presidential Primary Election

March 5, 2024 – California Presidential Primary

Ballots will be mailed beginning on February 5, 2024

Requests to Vote-by-Mail must arrive by February 27, 2024

November 5, 2024 – General Election


#### On the March 5<sup>th</sup> Ballot:

The State legislature voted to send four constitutional amendments to statewide ballots. These amendments are:

- An amendment to repeal the local voter requirement for publicly0-funded housing projects classified as low rent. Vote NO, because a yes vote would repeal Article 34 which requires local voter approval for federal and/or state government funded housing projects classified as low rent.
- An amendment to establish right to marry and repeal Proposition 8. **Vote NO**, because a. yes vote would repeal Proposition 8, which states that marriage is only between a man and a woman.
- An amendment to require initiative that change vote thresholds to supermajority votes to pass. Currently, initiated constitutional amendments need to be approved by a simple majority. This amendment would increase voter approval thresholds for state or local measures. **Vote NO**.
- An amendment to lower the vote threshold from 66.67% to 55% for local special taxes to fund housing projects and public infrastructure. **Vote NO**.

Citizens Initiated ballot measures On the March 5<sup>th</sup> Ballot (Citizen Initiated State Statue - CISS) *When in doubt, vote NO.* 

- California \$18 Minimum Wage Initiative. **Vote NO**, because increasing minimum wage to \$18 per hour by 2026 increases the cost of living. The existing law was designed to increase the minimum wage to \$15 per hour for all employers by January 2023, and increasing it annually according to inflation.
- California Employee Civil Action Law and PAGA Repeal Initiative. This initiative is supported by Californians for Fair Pay and Accountability. Currently, there is no opposition to this initiative. However, the fiscal impact is likely to increase in state costs to enforce labor laws that could exceed \$100 million per year. Reduction in state penalty revenue used for labor law enforcement in the tens of millions of dollars annually.
  - Repeals 2004 law allowing employees to file lawsuits on behalf of themselves and other employees against employers to recover monetary penalties for certain state labor law violations.
- California Pandemic Early Detection and Prevention Institute Initiative. **Vote NO**, because this increases the income tax by 0.75% for individuals with income of \$5 million for 10 years.
- California Prohibit State Limitations on Local Rent Control Initiative. **Vote NO**, this initiative repeals the rental housing act from 1995 which prohibits rent control on single-family homes and houses and allow cities and counties to limit rent on any housing and limit the rent for a first-time tenant. This initiative expands local governments authority to enact rent control on residential property.
