Somebody in Fulton County politics is sending a message to the judge to be careful how he rules in this case or a major effort *could* be made to kick him off the bench, next election.

When Judge McAfee ruled, the other day, that DA Willis could stay on-the-job but her principle prosecutor and former lover had to go...you heard nothing about this political threat to McAfee's reelection in ANY of the newspaper, TV or radio coverage! Did the judge alter his ruling because of the threat? Who knows? But, his compromise ruling keeping DA Willis in place might be an attempt for McAfee to placate his political critics and for him to keep his job. Do you see how vicious these Democrats can be and what means they will use to control even legal arguments and rulings? Housecleaning needs to happen even at the local level. That's why this election in November is so important!
