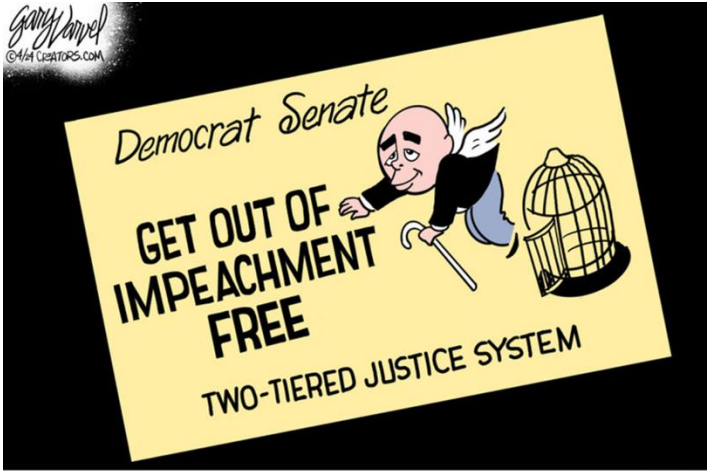
HELP! We are looking for a Secretary.

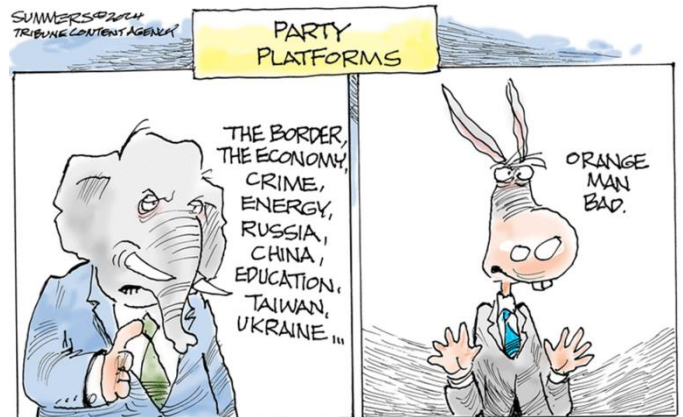

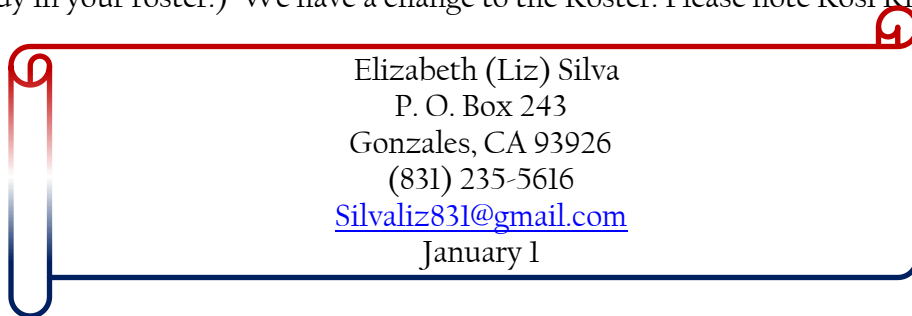

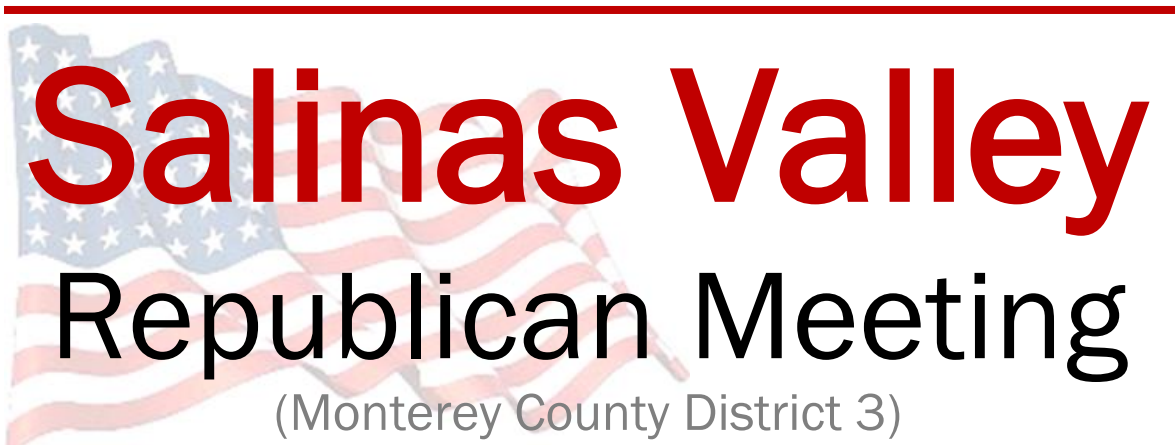
