


COLUMBUS INDIGEN

My first impression of the Trump/Harris debate was that Harris baited him with stuff she knew were lies just to push his buttons and set him off, making him look bad and out of control. Many pundits who analyzed the debate said the same thing. But, when you go back and take a second look, Harris did nothing but spout the non-committal rhetoric she spent a week memorizing and it was Trump who made the best points despite the fact that moderators David Muir and Linsay Davis felt they needed to prop up a weak candidate, letting her get away with telling falsehoods while "fact checking" Trump at least five times. Trump used the one minute rebuttal rule to point out the lies against him and he effectively used some humor, a technique Ronald Reagan used




Debates are complex rhetorical games and this one was further complicated by the obvious misconduct of so-called journalists Muir and Davis who were nowhere near as "middle-of-the-road" as were the moderators of the previous CNN debate between Trump and Biden. Dana Walden, who is in-charge of ABC News, is a longtime contributor to the Democrat National Committee. Could it be that because David Muir and Linsay Davis work for Walden and knew in what direction their boss would like to see this debate go, the moderators tended to favor Harris over Trump? In fact in doing so just made Harris look weak and needing some propping up. In doing so, Muir and Davis breached professional broadcast ethics by

engaging in such a partisan display. Despite using her skills as an attorney and prosecutor, Kamala Harris really

only showed us that she could memorize talking points and effectively deliver them to the camera. On the other hand Donald Trump stole the show when he turned to Harris and asked her why, in the past three and a half years, she didn't get everything done on her "to do" list. Did all of this make a difference? Maybe we'll find out the first week in November.

On another quick subject: Steve Kirsch, the venture capitalist from Silicon Valley, continues to find evidence that the Covid vaccines have increased the overall mortality rate in every country in which they were administered. 
