

YOUR ANNUAL SMCRWF DUES AT WORK

Southern Monterey County Republican Women Federated annual dues have been the same amount (\$25) since the club was established in 2000. Of your annual dues, \$18 is sent to California Federation of Republican Women Northern Division (CFRWND). Your \$25 dues payment is disbursed as follows:

\$10.00 is forwarded to the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) for your membership in the largest volunteer political women's organization in the United States.

\$1.40 is allocated for your dues in the California Federation of Republican Women (CFRW), the largest state federation with a membership of 13,000 women.

\$3.00 goes to our Advocacy program in Sacrament, (LASOF) where we have a full time Advocate who interacts with our state legislature and provides weekly updates on current bills. California is the only state in the Federation to have this program.

\$3.60 is collected by our Northern Division. California is such a large state that it is divided into three divisions so that clubs may join together for conferences and workshops that are more geographically accessible.

\$7.00 remains with Southern Monterey County Republican Women Federated (SMCRWF) to help support the following:

- + College Scholarships for King City High and Greenfield High Seniors
- + Purchase books for donation to elementary and high schools
- + Postage expense for packages to the Troops
- + Lunch & Honorariums for monthly Speakers as required
- + Costs for printing and distribution of monthly newsletters sent to all members & associates
- + Insurance costs for club events
- + Donations to local organizations
- + Post Office Box rent
- + Chamber of Commerce dues
- + Registration fees for Club President and members to attend Federated Women conferences




