



I want to thank the Southern Monterey Republican Women Federated organization and anyone affiliated with it who supported my campaign to continue to serve on the South Monterey County Joint Union High School board. I especially want to thank President Kathy Forgnone and her mother Karen Leonhard, two of the most welcoming women I have had the pleasure of meeting.
